



DENTAL CARE:

All children in Denmark are entitled to free dental and orthodontic health care from the age of 0 to 18 provided they have a Central Population Registry number (CPR nr – the 10 digit number which can be found on your yellow, plastic card - 'Sygesikringsbevis / Sundhedskort')

Each municipality (kommune) has a central dental clinic, many of which are located either close to or in the grounds of public schools. Staffs are specially trained to work with children and treat only children. Once your child is on the lists of the school dentist you will be called for regular check ups with your child.

Contact your kommune's 'Borger Service' to find the location and contact details of your Dental Clinic.

Unfortunately those people who are not recorded in the Central Population Registry will need to find their own private dentist and pay for treatment. The Danish Dentists Association website has a database of all of the dental clinics in Denmark. By entering your postcode you can get a list of all of the clinics in your area.
